Leffler House and Carriage House Updates

Since the closure of the Cathedral Shop, many have asked what would happen to the space in Leffler House that the Cathedral Shop used to occupy. Meanwhile, the Carriage House was rendered unusable due to severe damage caused by a tree branch during high winds last winter. Both spaces are now reopening for use by the community.

As part of the renovations to the building, **Leffler Living Room** has undergone substantial changes. The wall-to-wall carpet has been removed, and beautiful hardwood flooring has been uncovered. Generous donations of furniture, art, decor, and a large rug have transformed the space. The seating area and the large table have switched places—the couch and armchairs are arranged around the fireplace, and the table is located by the south-facing windows—making both spaces more comfortable and functional than they were before. [Please note: never attempt to move the furniture, especially the large table. Doing so could severely damage the newly revealed wood floors.]

The shop space itself will now be known as **Leffler Sun Room**. In the front section, it contains a second large table that seats up to 12 people—another generous donation. The rear of the shop is a cozy, light-filled seating area with a beautiful view of the Greenbelt. While the two spaces are somewhat separate, there is no door between them, and they will be reserved as a single room.

Finally, the **Carriage House** has been repaired, repainted, and renovated. In the main meeting room, the old drop

Playdate in Volunteer Park



New system for weekday parking launched



An all-parish email was sent out announcing a new arrangement for parking in the cathedral lots. **Parking will remain free and open all day Sunday.** However, Monday through Saturday, 9 a.m. to 10 p.m., the lower lot on the south side of the building has become a paid lot, as indicated

by painted stripes and posted signs. The upper portion of the south lot and the spaces along the north side of the cathedral are designated “Permit Parking Only”—Saint Mark’s members can get a windshield decal that will allow them to park in these areas while here on cathedral business. People parking in the lot for other reasons will pay by the hour using the PassportParking website or mobile app (www.passportparking.com—request zone #1989).
