






Psalm 71: 1-3

Leader Bless physicians, nurses, and all who minister to the suffering,
granting them wisdom and skill, sympathy and patience;
All **Hear us, O Giver of life.**

Leader Grant to the dying peace and a holy death, and uphold those who grieve;

All Hear us, O Giver of life.

Leader Restore to wholeness all that is broken by human sin,
in our lives and in our world;

All Hear us, O Giver of life.

Leader You are the One who does wonders:

All You have shown your power through the ages.

Leader With you, O God, is the well of life:

All And in your light we see light.

Leader Hear us, O Giver of life:

All Heal us, and make us whole.

Leader Let us pray.

A period of silence follows.

Leader **A**LMIGHTY GOD, giver of life and health: Send your blessing on all who are sick, all who are grieving, all who seek your healing and comfort, that all weakness, heartache, and fear may be transformed by the peace of Christ.

All Amen.
