All seeking God are welcome at Christ's Table.

Please follow the directions of the Liturgical Ministers. Bread is distributed at standing stations at the head of the aisles. Before receiving the bread, please sanitize your hands. The bread will be placed into your outstretched palm taking care not to touch your hand. Communion is currently being offered in one kind. The full grace of the sacrament is received with only the bread. If you prefer a gluten-free wafer, simply ask for one at the time of Communion.

MARILYN JANE DAUBER

June 23rd, 1961 – September 8th, 2021

On Wednesday, September 8, 2021, Marilyn Jane Dauber, loving wife and mother, passed away at the age of 60, after a three year battle with stage four metastatic breast cancer. Jane, as she always preferred to be called, lived in Seattle on and off for thirty seven years, with the exception of a number of years spent living abroad in England, Scotland, and South Africa. She resided in Queen Anne with her husband Todd after their marriage in 2000, and happily welcomed their daughter Celia into their life in 2003. She's been happily parenting and tending to family, friends, charities and work ever since.

Jane was born on June 23, 1961 in Salem, Oregon, to Walt and Joan Dauber, and for most of her early childhood, grew up in Yakima, Washington, with her younger brother Paul and family. Jane graduated from Eisenhower High School in Yakima in 1979, and went on to Washington State University, where she graduated in 1983. She was an enthusiastic and devoted member of the Tri-Delt sorority at WSU, and remained good friends with a number of her sorority sisters from her college years to present day.

In 1992, Jane had an opportunity to participate in an exchange program within Aldus that allowed her to move from the Seattle Office to work at Aldus UK in Edinburgh, where she rapidly made a number of friends in England, Scotland and Ireland. She greatly enjoyed her time there, and has numerous friends (family, more accurately) scattered throughout the UK and Europe. Jane loved to travel, and frequently worked in countries in Europe, South America, Africa and Asia, and traveled for personal enjoyment throughout most of the rest of the world. Sadly, she never made it to Antarctica- an unfulfilled dream of hers.

Jane returned to Seattle after her UK visa expired, and worked for a number of companies as a Project Manager (and heavy lifter) before and throughout her marriage; Intel, Watts/Silverstein, Carabiner, TPN, Green Rubino, Northbound (and others), until her retirement in 2020. She contracted her cancer in 2018, and fought bravely throughout her treatment, only succumbing after the cancer spread to her brain and spine. She will be profoundly missed by her family, and all of us who knew and loved her. Hers was truly a life well lived.
