## Introduction

- The BCP shapes how we worship, what we believe, how we see ourselves and how we see the world.
- Used around the world across the Anglican Communion.

# What is the Book of Common Prayer?

- 1549 the changing landscape of English Reformation
- Profoundly scriptural in reference
- Meant to be not just a service book but a guide for all aspects Christian living.
- Designed to inform daily life, seasonal, individual and communal, holy days, etc.
- Not static—1789 BCP, etc.—Elizabethan English yields to contemporary language (of the people)—theologically diverse (Via Media)
- Aesthetic and nonverbal elements of worship speak to the core of our being
- 1979 BCP—centering Baptism and Eucharist
- Prayer Book Revision—taking the long view (incarnational)
