
Opening Prayer

 - Energy in buildings
 - Transport
 - 60% of the city's GHG from transport

One Person Makes a Difference


- When we help others, those around us are more likely to help too

A Framework for Action

- Advocate
 - Participate in meetings
 - Respond to calls for consultation
 - Join a group
 - Meet council or agency members
 - Write
 - Petition
- Educate
 - Write articles
 - Letter to the editor
 - Create podcasts
 - Create videos





The Rationale for Action

- Sharing opinions and concerns with our representatives is essential to democracy
- Without effective advocacy, representatives are certain to get some things wrong
- The voice of people is a vital source of understanding for legislators
- Join with others who care about the same issues
- A consistent presence and pressure of advocacy is essential
- There is never a bad time to write or phone or lobby your local council member



Exemplify Action

- Speak up: Normalize caring by talking about things you do to mitigate climate change
- Be an early adopter who's willing to take risks
 - De-risk and normalize the path forward
- Publicly reveal your preferences


