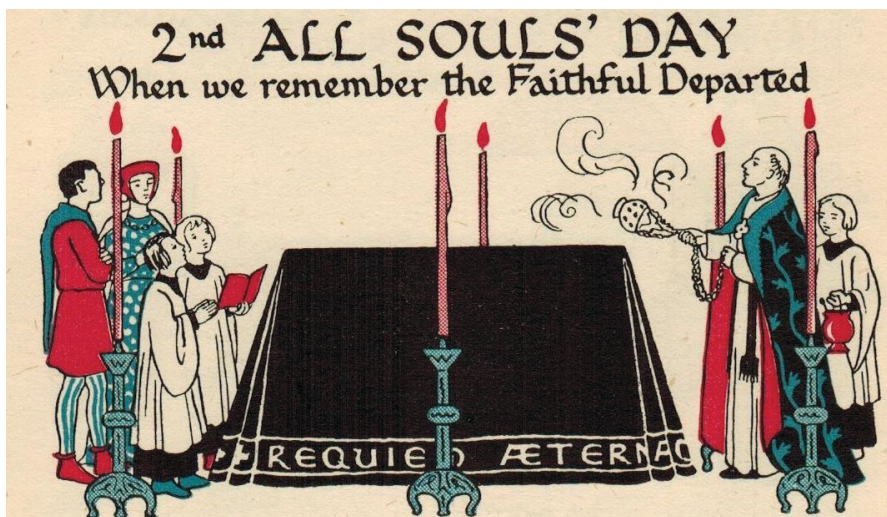

OPENING SONG *Tar a thighearna*

WORDS: chant from the Céile Dé
TUNE: Ruth Cunningham

PRONUNCIATION: *Tahr ah hear-nah, tar ah hee.*

TRANSLATION: *Come, O Lord, come thou Being.*

Visit this place, O Lord, and drive far from it all snares of the enemy; let your holy angels dwell with us to preserve us in peace; and let your blessing be upon us always; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. **Amen.**

Officiant Guide us waking, O Lord,

All and guard us sleeping;
that awake we may watch with Christ,
and asleep we may rest in peace.

Officiant Lord, you now have set your servant free

All to go in peace as you have promised;
For these eyes of mine have seen the Savior, *
whom you have prepared for all the world to see:
A Light to enlighten the nations, *
and the glory of your people Israel.
Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: *
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.
