

## Waste in the US is Enormous

#### The total amount of waste includes:


- Clothing: 11.3 million tons/year, or 81.5 pounds/person, or 2150 pieces/second
- Furniture: 9.6 million tons/year
- Appliances: 3.7 million tons/year
  - 5% of small appliances are recycled
- 2.4 million tons of carpets
- Other (electronics, luggage, sporting goods): 23 million tons
- (1 million tons ~ 150,000 elephants)


#### An Alternative is to Reuse

- Reuse is taking old items that you might consider throwing away and finding a new use for them
  - Reusing or adapting old items also avoids energy costs, carbon emissions & recycling inefficiencies
- Creative reuse is repurposing a manufactured item or material for a new function




# Fashion - A Case Study in Waste & Reuse

- Fashion causes 10% of CO2 emissions
- Clothes washing and care causes 1/3 of clothing's carbon footprint
- Extending the active life of 50% of clothing by 9 months could save 8% of carbon, 10% of water, & 4% of waste per metric ton of clothing, per WRAP
- Love Your Clothes encourages better purchase, care, repair and disposal of clothing



# A Spiritual Framework

- Matthew 4:21 He saw two other brothers,
  James the son of Zebedee, and John his
  brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father,
  mending their nets; and He called them
- Isaiah 58:7,12 Share your food with the hungry, and give shelter to the homeless. Give clothes to those who need them... Some of you will rebuild the deserted ruins of your cities.
- 1 Timothy 6:18: Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share



# One Alternative is a Circular Economy


- A circular economy keeps materials, products and services in circulation for as long possible
- It involves sharing, leasing, reusing, repairing, refurbishing and recycling materials and products as long as possible so their life cycle is extended
- Clothes, scrap metal, obsolete electronics and more are returned to the economy or used more efficiently
- A circular economy could address 70% of global greenhouse emissions.



# An Option is Buy Nothing

- BuyNothing is a gift economy on a hyperlocal scale that brings neighbors together through sharing and community
  - Share physical items, self & time
- Process
  - Community settings & address
  - Give, ask, share and thank, freely
    - Avoid buying things
  - Connect with neighbors






### The "Rules of Reuse"

- 1) Bring your own
- 2) Avoid single use at home
- 3) Upcycle
- 4) Give or donate
- 5) Sell it
- 6) Choose 'Reuse' before you buy new
- 7) Repair, refurbish or recover
- 8) Choose pre-loved items



# A Framework for Reuse - Buying

- Reuse your own items instead of buying
- Rent or borrow instead of buying
- Buy used items to reduce waste as well as emissions created by producing new materials or disposing of them
- Buy and use reusable items instead of disposable, including napkins, water bottles, travel mugs, straws and utensils
- Do you even need to own the item in the first place?



# A Framework for Reuse – Repair/Repurpose

- Maintain and repair products such as clothing, tires, digital devices, garden tools and appliances so they won't be thrown out and replaced as frequently
- Learn to repair items
  - A little know-how or friendly help makes it easier
- Reimagine, to create new uses for old items
- Rethink, Reuse, Repair\*



#### A Framework for Reuse - Donations

- <u>Donate</u> unused clothing, electronics and building materials to make sure others can reuse them too
- Many organizations accept donations
  - Goodwill
  - Salvation Army thrift stores
  - Habitat for Humanity
  - Assistance League
- Or, re-sell: Give unwanted items another life by advertising or posting them
- Platforms include Craigslist

# Shop with Reuse in Mind

- Use devices, clothes and other items as long as possible
  - Avoid the latest release
- Buy upgradable computers and cellphones
- Avoid single-use items
  - Paper towels, diapers, Ziplock bags, plastic wrap
- Buy used renovation supplies from places such as Habitat ReStore
- Buy extra food from businesses
  - TooGoodToGo



#### Reuse Food

- <u>Tea leaves</u> for broth or compost
- Coffee grounds for pest control, scouring pads & rose or tomato fertilizer
- Coffee ground or tea leaf cookies
- <u>Eggshells</u> for seedlings, compost, bird food and Christmas decorations
- Banana bread



#### Use Reusable Items


- Reusable water bottle
  - Using a disposable water bottle a day for a year results in the same climate pollution as driving 147 miles
- Reusable shopping bags
- Reuse clothes in different ways and places



# Repair your Devices, Tools and Gadgets

- Fix your phone
- Sew
- Re-finish furniture
- Sharpen knives and garden tools
- Learn on YouTube with how-to videos
- Check out ifixit.com for repair guides





# Repurpose Creatively

- Repurpose things for a "second life", such as turning glass food jars into pen holders or old clothes into dust rags
- Wooden pallets become tables
- Use old bicycle wheels for garden trellises
- Turn a tire into a tire swing
- Wrap gifts in newspaper
- Turn boxes or magazine pictures into cards
- Crafts



# Creativity

- Turn wine bottles Into candle holders
- Use old shopping bags or magazines as gift wrapping
- Turn old sheets into rags
- Tear old towels into strips, tie them in knots and create a new toy for your dog
- Use empty plastic soda bottles or glass jars as planters for flowers and herbs
- Before you dump it: Can it be fixed?




