When you experience Evensong, it is as if you were dropping in on a conversation already in progress—a conversation between God and his people which began long before you were born and which will continue long after your death. So, do not be surprised or disturbed if there are some things which you do not understand straight away. For a brief moment, you step into the continual stream of worship which is being offered today and which will be offered to the end of time. You are one with those who worship here on earth and in heaven.



READING

Zechariah 12:9-11, 13:1, 7-9

Thus says the Lord: on that day I will seek to destroy all the nations that come against Jerusalem.

And I will pour out a spirit of compassion and supplication on the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that, when they look on the one whom they have pierced, they shall mourn for him, as one mourns for an only child, and weep bitterly over him, as one weeps over a firstborn. On that day the mourning in Jerusalem will be as great as the mourning for Hadad-rimmon in the plain of Megiddo.

On that day a fountain shall be opened for the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, to cleanse them from sin and impurity.

"Awake, O sword, against my shepherd, against the man who is my associate," says the LORD of hosts.

Strike the shepherd, that the sheep may be scattered; I will turn my hand against the little ones.

In the whole land, says the LORD, two-thirds shall be cut off and perish, and one-third shall be left alive.

And I will put this third into the fire, refine them as one refines silver, and test them as gold is tested.

They will call on my name, and I will answer them.

I will say, "They are my people"; and they will say, "The LORD is our God." ◆





### **SALUTATION & THE LORD'S PRAYER**




who art in heaven,

All you have given us grace at this time


with one accord to make our common supplication to you; and you have promised through your well-beloved Son that when two or three are gathered together in his Name you will be in the midst of them:

Fulfill now, O Lord, our desires and petitions


