

Come now and look upon the works of the LORD, * what awesome things he has done on earth.


It is he who makes war to cease in all the world; * he breaks the bow, and shatters the spear, and burns the shields with fire.




("Kyrie eleison; Christe eleison." is Greek for "Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy.")

THE LORD'S PRAYER (prayed by all)



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ABOUT THE ICON: The icon that is the focus of our prayer tonight is "Christ Pantocrator" (meaning "Ruler of All"). It was written by Alexander Stalnov in 2004 and lives across from the "Virgin of the Sign" icon in McCaw Chapel. Saint Mark's icons are the fruit of special relationships developed by the Russian Parish Partnership, a program led by Jane and Dick Carter which included several pilgrimages to Russia in the 1990s and 2000s.



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
