## **DISCUSSION QUESTION:**

1. The theme of trees abounds throughout the entire Bible, both as a metaphor for connectedness and as a gift of nature's abundance—the tree of life, the family tree, the cross, olive, almond and willow trees. What comes to mind for you when you think of trees, either as a metaphor for spiritual and familial connectedness or as a gift of nature?

- Isaiah 25:6–8 On this mountain the LORD of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines...he will swallow up death forever. Then the Lord GoD will wipe away the tears from all faces.
- 1 Cor. 15:55 Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?
- Rev. 21:4–6 He will wipe every tear from their eyes, Death will be no more.... See, I am making all things new.... I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end.

1. The Christmas season often brings both celebration and sadness to adults—heaven and earth. Thich Nhat Hanh wrote, "The wave does not need to die to become water. She is already water." How can contemplating death help you find joy in the present and a spiritual connection?

# Waiting in the Wilderness

Themes: The "voice in the wilderness," as we wait for the second coming of Christ. We also look at the idea of 500-year cycles, wisdom schools, and John the Baptist's story.

Isaiah 40:3-5 A voice cries out in the wilderness, prepare the way of the LORD.... Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed.

#### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:**

- 1. While most of us may have difficulty thinking of ourselves as prophets, or putting on the mantle of Christ as baptized people, how can we as individuals help bring the kingdom of God into the present? How can we sow the seeds of a peaceable kingdom?
- 2. The theme of wilderness and exile run through both Isaiah and the story of John the Baptist. In our present day, increasing numbers of people are exiles—fleeing violence, war, poverty, or the increasing climate change disasters. Besides prayer, have you felt called to help others in some way?
